Business Information Center Hosts Grand Opening

A grand opening celebration was held for the Business Information Center (BIC) on August 29.

Distinguished guests included U.S. Senator Blanche Lincoln; U.S.

Congressman Mike Ross; Clifton Toulson, Associate Administrator for Business and Community Initiatives of the U.S. Small Business Administration; Joe Foglia,

Director of the Arkansas District Office of the U.S. Small Business Administration; and Dutch King, Pine Bluff Mayor. In addition, the Pine Bluff Chamber of Commerce, representatives from various state economic development agencies and local entrepreneurs attended the event.

The BIC is a one-stop small business planning and resource center. The great news for existing and aspiring business owners is that you no longer have to spend endless hours creating business materials from scratch.

The center offers more than 2,000 small business planning tools including: a resource library of more than 500 business publications, CD-ROMs and videos; Internet access for market research; eight computer workstations loaded with a variety of business software; fax, scanner, copy machines, color and laser printers; and free business counseling services.

"The BIC is a beneficial service for small businesses in Arkansas and Pine Bluff," says Miriam Karanja, director of the ARWBDC. "The research tools and invaluable advice

can help a new business get off the ground or help an existing business grow."

Located in the ARWBDC office at 2304 W. 29th in Pine Bluff, the BIC is open weekdays from 8 a.m. until

5 p.m. and evenings by appointment. Men and women who are in business or are interested in starting a business can use the BIC as often as they wish at no charge. For some individuals, visits to the BIC may be frequent, as they do the research necessary to make a decision to start a business. Existing business owners may use the BIC less frequently, but will find many resources aimed at business growth.
